

Cambridge English Language Proficiency Test

Cambridge English language proficiency test on Up Skill an android phone app was conducted by IQAC, Career Counseling Cell and English department of the college in association with Naandi Foundation. The test comprised of Reading, Listening, Writing & Speaking module. Naandi foundation conducted this test free of cost for girl students. 150 students appeared for this test. This test was conducted on Android phones using artificial intelligence. The test offered an extremely convenient way for the students to take an assessment and get instant results through official report from an internationally recognized examination board that indicates the candidate's overall score for each skill using the CEFR level scale. Principal Dr.(Mrs.)Neeru Sharma applauded the Career Counselling Cell for conducting this test. She said such tests provide a real experience to students to appear for tests such as IELTS, TOFLE and PTE. It helped to improve their communication and skills.



Nature Camp

Under Environment Education Programme a three day 'NATURE CAMP' was attended by the Environment Association and Botany department of the college in concert with "Samagr Unnayan Foundation" supported by Ministry Of Environment Forest And Climate Change. 50 students participated in this nature camp at Harike Wildlife Sanctuary. The sanctuary is managed by the Department of Forests and Wildlife Preservation, Punjab and protected under the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 and amended Act, 2002. The outcome of such an exceptionally enlightening, enriching camp led participants to gain a deeper understanding of the connection between human activities and the environment. This understanding resulted in concrete changes in behavior, such as reducing the use of plastics and actively supporting wildlife conservation. Students were provided cloth bags to promote environment friendly practices. On the second day, the students were enriched with knowledge of Pug mark. Pug Mark identification is a

technique used in tracking and studying animals, particularly big cats like tigers and leopards. It involves identifying and analyzing the footprints or tracks left behind by these animals as they move through their habitat. On the third day students presented a street play. They were divided into groups and performed skits with messages focusing on the environment. Finally, Mr. Pallove, Madam Shikha, Mr. Sunal Roamin and Mr. Manik were honored by the college principal. Mr. Pallove honored the students with titles such as Leadership, Discipline Maintainer, Good in Painting and Good in Photography. The college Principal appreciated Ms. Samita khajuria and Ms. Amita for their efforts.
