GENERAL RULES, REQUIREMENTS & ELIGIBILITIES FOR ADMISSION

1. A Candidate seeking admission to the college is required to fulfill the following requirements: -
 - a) To fill in all the particulars on the prescribed admission form (appended in the prospectus) in her own handwriting. Incomplete form will be rejected.
 - b) To affix two passport size copies of latest photographs, two additional photographs and one photograph of candidate's parents on the specified space in the admission form.
 - c) To attach the following certificates/documents with the admission form.
 - i) Certified copies of detailed marks card of having passed the lower examination.
 - ii) A copy of matriculation certificate as a proof of date of birth.
 - iii) Character certificate from the head of the institution last attended as regular student.
 - iv) Students belong to scheduled caste/Tribe/Backward class are required to attach a certificate to the effect from the competent authority.
 - v) Self attested copy of Aadhaar Card.
 - vi) Residence Certificate
 - vii) Bank Account Number / Pass Book
 - viii) Email Id
 - ix) Blood Group Report
 - x) Low Income Proof for SC
2. Students from the Universities of Punjab or P.S.E.B will not be required to produce eligibility certificate from G.N.D.U. Amritsar. A student from any other Indian University/Board/College seeking migration to the college will be required to attach the following additional documents:-
 - a) Inter-University Migration certificate
 - b) Inter College migration certificate
 - c) Eligibility certificate from G.N.D.U.
3. Failed/Detained/Absent student from any College/ University exam will not be admitted to the college in any case.
4. Student whose result of the lower examination is notified as "Result Late" by other Board or University will not be admitted to the next higher class even provisionally.
5. The student whose result is declared late by Board/University can get admission within 10 days (From the date of declaration of result) without any late fee.
6. Compartment cases from the Board/ University other than P.S.E.B and G.N.D.U are not eligible for admission.
7. Students admitted provisionally to any class are required to submit the original certificate of the lower examination passed within 30 days of the admission for the issue of University registration number to confirm admission by University. In case of noncompliance of the same, the admission of the student shall stand cancelled automatically and dues paid by the student shall not be refunded.
8. The principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any candidate if she is satisfied that the refusal is in the interest of the college.
9. To maintain the high academic standards in the college, the eligibility for all classes will be laid down by the college authorities which will be either at par or above the minimum requirements of G.N.D.U. The decision of the college authorities in this regard shall be final and the criteria may be revised from time to time during admission period.
10. Meritorious students, outstanding players, speakers, singers and other Artists shall be given due weightage for the purpose of admission. Such students shall be required to produce certificate to this effect from the head of the institution last attended.
11. Admission to all classes of the college is provisional at the sole responsibility of the student concerned and subject to the approval of P.S.E.B/ G.N.D.U. If any admission is not approved by the relevant authority for the reason that the student has failed to provide the documents in time or has concealed some information, the entire responsibility in such case will be of the student and she will not be entitled to any refund whatsoever from the college.
12. The college authorities reserve the right to get the authenticity of all certificates/documents submitted by the candidate for the purpose of seeking confirmation of admission in any class verified at anytime, from the concerned issuing officials/officers.

In order to facilitate efficient and smooth functioning of the college, it is imperative to maintain proper discipline and decorum in compliance with the following rules and regulations:

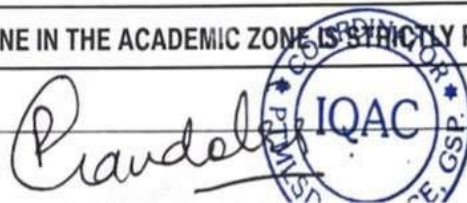
- A student involved in any immoral / anti-social act is liable to be expelled without any warning and there will be no reconsideration whatsoever.

- Attendance in regular classes, tutorial groups, remedial groups, advance learner groups and add on classes is compulsory.
- Loud talking and loitering in the corridors being the source of disturbance to others is not permitted.
- Students should make use of the dustbins placed in the campus.
- During free periods students should go to the library / student center and utilize their free time in academic / co-curricular pursuits.
- Students are expected to show due respect to the teaching staff and all other employees of the college.
- Student must park their vehicles in proper parking.
- Students should not keep heavy cash and jewellery in their bags / purses.
- It is a duty of every student to read all the notices posted on WhatsApp group, college notice board and check email regularly.
- Attending Monday assembly is compulsory for all students and faculty.
- Leaving the campus before 1:00 pm is not allowed without the prior permission of the Principal.
- Students will have to wear uniform on every Monday.
- Students must carry I card with them in the campus and produce it on demand by authority.
- Damage to the college property caused by students will be duly recovered from them.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATIONS

1. During the Academic Session, there will be two semesters. In semester-I and II students will have to undergo pre semester exams in the month of April & October.
2. In Pre-Semester Test, students of UG classes are required to secure 35% marks and PG classes 40% marks in each subject for being eligible to sit in final exams.

ATTENDANCE

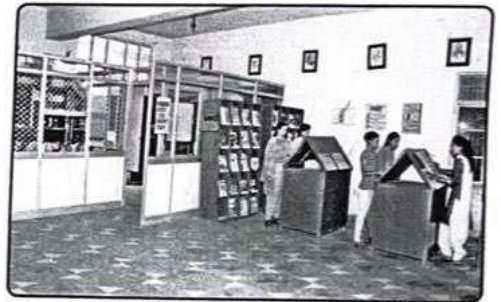
1. The students on the rolls of the college must be regular in attendance in all the subjects.
2. According to University norms, attendance of 75% of lectures is mandatory.
3. A student who remains absent from the college without leave for 10 days continuously shall be dropped from the rolls. She may be re-admitted with the consent of the principal on payment of the re-admission fee of Rs. 500/- for up to 15 days and Rs. 1000/- for upto 30 days. The fine for absence shall have to be paid. The lectures attended without being readmitted shall not be counted.
4. The shortage in attendance and the results of the house examinations shall be conveyed to the parents during PT meets.
5. Parents should attend all PT meets along with their wards and enquire about the attendance & performance.

LEAVE RULES

1. A student should apply for leave and get it sanctioned in advance.
2. Medical leave of upto eight days can be availed in the Academic session only if supported by a medical certificate issued by a Medical Officer.
3. Leave upto a period of three days shall be granted by the respective class teachers. Leave for more than 3 days shall be granted by the Principal.
4. No leave will be granted during College Functions and House Examinations.

LIBRARY RULES

1. The library remains open on all working days from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.
2. A student can borrow two books at a time for a period of two weeks.
3. Staff members can borrow maximum five books at a time for a period of one month.
4. Marking, underlining or writing on library books, periodicals and newspapers is strictly forbidden.
5. Use of cell phones is not allowed if readers wish to keep them while using the library, it must be switched off.
6. Eating, sleeping and talking loudly are strictly prohibited in library.
7. Reference books, journals, periodicals, magazines, newspapers declared 'For Reference' by the librarian will not be issued.
8. Return books on due date, so that others can read it.
9. News clippings file can be used only in the library.
10. Silence shall be maintained in the library and speak softly if needed

8. Study of common disease in the village and basic data from community health centre
9. Adopt any five young plants and photograph its growth
10. Analyze the Total dissolved solids of ground water samples in your area.
11. Study of Particulate Matter (PM_{2.5} or PM₁₀) data from Sameer website. Download from Play store.
12. Perspective on any field on Environmental Studies with secondary data taken from Central Pollution Control Board, State Pollution Control Board, State Science & Technology Council etc.

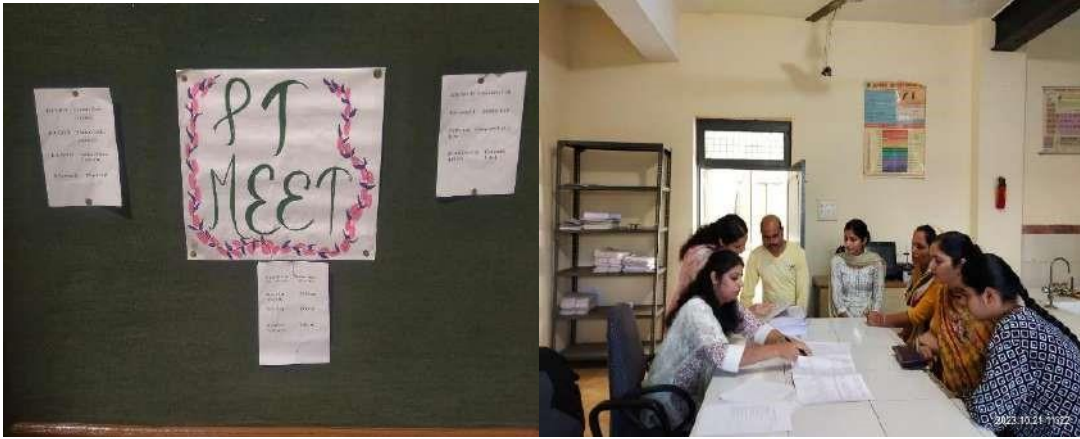

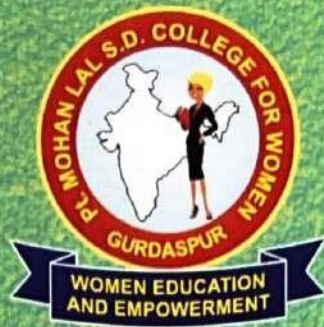


